WHO?

Five girls aged 15 - 17 years **as of January 1st, 2010**

And Two Guiders

*In order to qualify, participants must be physically fit and be active Members of Girl Guides of Canada.

Note: In order that as many Members as possible have the opportunity to participate in nationally sponsored international events, Members selected may participate in these events as follows:

- once as a girl
- once as a young adult (the young adult category is usually between the ages of 18 and 25, but may vary)
- once as an adult

WHAT?

100th Birthday Celebrations

An International Camp to celebrate 100 years of Guiding in Australia and around the world. The program will include onsite and offsite activities, explore the city of Melbourne, choose from horse riding or maybe even camel riding! Sail in a tall ship, surf at an ocean beach, explore Sovereign Hill and strike gold, or visit the home of the fairy penguins and seals on Phillip Island. Make friends with Guides from all over Australia and other countries of the world.

WHAT WILL IT COST?

For girl Members:

As a Member of Girl Guides of Canada, you will receive financial subsidy through the Canadian World Friendship Fund (CWFF) that will cover:

- \$700 financial subsidy
- Domestic airfare and taxes
- Medical/Illness Insurance Coverage

After the CWFF subsidy, the Estimated Cost for girl Members is: \$ 3,900.

This includes:

- International airfare and taxes
- Registration/Event Fees
- Accommodation - Toronto and Australia (if applicable)
- Tours and Transfers in Australia (pre/post event if applicable)

These figures may change slightly due to the increased international airfare and currency fluctuations.

Other personal costs Girl Members are responsible for include:

- Cost of meals en route before and after the event
- Travel to and from their local airport
- Personal spending money
- Kit list requirements
- Immunizations required
- Passport fees
- Souvenirs

If you need additional financial support, please check with your provincial international adviser to see if your provincial/territorial council may be able to assist you with this event.

For Guiders:

Financial Assistance

Girl Guides of Canada-Guides du Canada, (GGC), through the Jean Youngson Memorial Bequest to the Canadian World Friendship fund (CWFF), **will cover the following costs for each Guider:**

- Domestic and international travel and transportation costs
- Registration/Event Fee
- Cost of accommodation
- Medical/Illness Insurance

Estimated costs to Adult Members:

- Cost of meals en route before and after the event
- Souvenirs
- Personal Spending Money
- Kit List Requirements
- First Aid Kit supplies
- Passport Fees

Note for all Participants

1. Both girl and adult participants may be required to have uniform pieces that they do not own and it will be necessary to borrow or purchase these items.
2. If participation is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the Girl Guides of Canada will not accept responsibility for expenses incurred in preparation for this event.
3. Participation in this event by Canadian representatives is dependent on acceptable health and safety conditions in the country at the time of the event.
