WHEN?

July 27 - August 8, 2010

Event dates: July 31 – August 7, 2010

WHO?

- Five girls aged 14 ½ to 16 years of age **as of July 27, 2010**
- Two Guiders

*In order to qualify, participants must be physically fit and be active Members of Girl Guides of Canada.

Note: In order that as many Members as possible have the opportunity to participate in nationally sponsored international events, Members selected may participate in these events as follows:

- Once as a girl
- Once as a young adult (the young adult category is usually between the ages of 18 and 25, but may vary)
- Once as an adult

WHAT?

Participate in Girlguiding UK's biggest camp ever! Set in the breath-taking English countryside, this camp will bring together 10,000 Girl Guides and Girl Scouts from around the world to celebrate 100 years of Guiding.

With nine different activity zones – including Aqua, Creativity, Community service and Adventure on – campers will have hundreds of activities to choose from. Participation in this international event will also offer the chance to see some of London's world famous sites.

WHAT WILL IT COST?

For girl Members:

As a Member of Girl Guides of Canada, you will receive financial subsidy through the Canadian World Friendship Fund (CWFF) that will cover:

- \$700 financial subsidy
- Domestic airfare and taxes
- Medical insurance

After the CWFF subsidy, the Estimated Cost for girl Members is: \$1,900.

This includes:

- International airfare and taxes
- Registration/event fees
- Accommodation - Toronto and London, UK





- Transportation to and from the event in England

These figures may change slightly due to increases in international airfare and currency fluctuations.

Other personal costs girl Members are responsible for include:

- Meals en route before and after the event
- Travel to and from local airport
- Personal spending money
- Kit list requirements
- Any required immunizations
- Passport fees
- Tours and sightseeing costs in London before/after the camp

Provincial Council will offer financial support to the selected applicants of 20% of the final invoice amount from National.

For Guiders:

As a Member of Girl Guides of Canada, Guiders will receive funding through the Jean Youngson Memorial Bequest to the Canadian World Friendship fund (CWFF) for the following costs:

- Domestic and international travel
- Transportation to and from the event in England
- Registration/event Fee
- Cost of accommodation
- Medical insurance

Estimated costs to adult Members:

- Meals en route before and after the event
- Travel to and from local airport
- Any required immunizations
- Personal Spending Money
- Tours and sightseeing costs in London before/after the camp
- Kit list requirements
- Passport Fees
- First aid kit supplies
- You may be required to supply some camping equipment

Note for all Participants

1. Both girl and adult participants may be required to have uniform pieces that they do not own and it will be necessary to borrow or purchase these items.
2. If participation is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, Girl Guides of Canada will not accept responsibility for expenses incurred in preparation for this event.
3. Participation in this event by Canadian representatives is dependent on acceptable health and safety conditions in the country at the time of the event.
